Hérons in Florida. It can be seen in the Florida Keys as well as in the Everglades National Park in a town known as Flamingo. Their limited ranges means small numbers and their populations have been dangerously decimated by major hurricanes over the years. The Great White Heron National Refuge, located in the Florida Keys in 1938, was created for their protection.

Everglades Florida - Herons

The great blue heron grows to 4 feet tall with a 6 to 7 foot wingspan. Despite its large size, its hollow bones allow it to weigh only 5 to 6 pounds. It has a white head with long, black, feathery plumes; a long gray or brownish neck, often held in a graceful S-shape; a bluish-gray body; and underparts streaked with black, brown and white.

Great blue herons stand four feet tall, weigh slightly over four pounds, and have a wingspan of nearly seven feet. These herons are generally seen in their nesting colonies or in wetlands and along the river, where they feed on small fish, amphibians, and a variety of aquatic invertebrates.

Little blue herons breed within inland and coastal wetlands in the Gulf Coast and south-central states through Florida, Georgia, and the Carolinas. They also breed along the Pacific coast of Mexico and Central America, and the Gulf Coast of Mexico, the Caribbean, and the Atlantic coast as far north as Maine.
